# **School Self Evaluation Update**

As part of our ongoing School Self-Evaluation (SSE) process, this year we focused on two key areas: **Wellbeing** and **Literacy**, in line with Department of Education guidelines.

In **Wellbeing**, we reviewed current practices and gathered feedback from pupils and staff to ensure that the school continues to support the emotional and social development of every child. A range of initiatives were implemented to promote kindness, inclusion, and pupil voice. Looking ahead to the new school year, we will work towards new Wellbeing targets—one of which includes the **establishment of a Student Council** to further encourage leadership and participation among pupils.



In **Literacy**, feedback was gathered from pupils in First to Sixth Class. The responses were very positive and provided valuable insights into pupils' learning experiences. As a result of this feedback, teachers identified **spelling development** as an area for further focus and improvement.
